#### 7. AOCB

Back of toilets – cables exposed, metre broken etc rough with rocks to be reported to Scottish Water Arecleoch Wind farm to be extended and Colmonell and Lendalfoot will be included in the 6 communities who will benefit from this. Looking at early 2025, we need to as a community think about how the money will be administered. A Joint group would be required to be set-up between Lendalfoot and Colmonell with money coming direct to the group. £364 000 approx amount but not confirmed a year to be split between 6 communities. A SCIO was suggested as an option like a charity but less paperwork. Open meeting to be arranged to get those interested prior to forming a group.
